## IMPORTANT NOTES AND RULES

To reduce the risk of accidents and in the interest of user safety during tourist drives, capricorn NÜRBURGRING GmbH requires the following rules be observed and will penalise violations:

- **The provisions of the German Road Traffic Ordinance (StVO) shall apply.**
- Overtaking on the right is prohibited.
- Deliberate contamination of the track is prohibited.
- The track safety marshals must be notified of any contamination of the track.
- It is absolutely prohibited to continue driving if the vehicle is leaking coolant, oil or fuel.
- Each driver is required to carry his driving licence and the vehicle registration document.
- Prior to driving on the track vehicles will be inspected to ensure compliance with the German Road Traffic Licensing Regulations (StVZO).
- Drivers of vehicles not licensed in Germany must carry proof of insurance.
- Only vehicles that comply with the German Road Traffic Licensing Regulations (StVZO) are permitted to drive on the Nordschleife. Neither vehicles which cannot exceed a minimum speed of more than 60 km/h because of their construction or technical condition nor quad bikes are permitted to take part in tourist drives.
- **On the Nürburgring, the general rules on driving speeds according to Section 3 (1) StVO must be strictly adhered to.**
- Users are required to drive slowly on sections of the Nürburgring that are designated as roadworks. The speed limit shown must be observed.
- The noise threshold value is not allowed to exceed the level in accordance with the near field measurement method (95 dB [A]) and the maximum sound-power level (130 dB [A]) stipulated by capricorn NÜRBURGRING GmbH, measured when the vehicle is driving past.
- It is prohibited to take photographs, film or make video recordings during tourist drives.
- Within the scope of the tourist drives it is prohibited to provide commercial taxi trips whether for a fee or free of charge.
- **Signposted zones that are closed to visitors (such as track marshals' posts and areas behind guardrails) must not be entered. There is danger to life!**

## RULES FOR DRIVING TOGETHER SAFELY



Danger spots, overtaking prohibited, Pass danger spot at max. speed of 50 km/h.



Don't forget to put on seatbelts. The same goes for rear passenger seats.



Motorbikes should have their lights on.



Motorbike riders must wear full protective clothing.



Absolutely no stopping anywhere on the track.



No admittance for vehicles with export plates, temporary plates or vintage seasonal licence plates (07 number) / quad bikes.



No overtaking on the right. Overtaking is only permitted on the left. Violations will be penalised.



No admittance for vehicles with a maximum sound-power level of more than 130 dB [A].



Nordschleife emergency number. Ideally, save this number to your mobile phone: **+49 (0) 800 0302 112.**



Ensure that your vehicle is not leaking (coolant, oil, fuel). If you discover a leak, park the car immediately at the side of the track. Warn drivers behind you. Call the Nordschleife emergency number: **+49 (0) 800 0302 112.**



Accidents and broken-down vehicles must always be secured with a warning triangle.



Driving induction and convoys are prohibited. The provisions of the German Road Traffic Ordinance (StVO) and the German Road Traffic Licensing Regulations (StVZO) apply.



When the amber light is flashing, drivers must be able to stop at any time within their field of vision. Greatly reduce speed.

### BETTER SAFE THAN SORRY!

The Nordschleife is not only the most beautiful tarmac anywhere between the North and South Poles – it also bears the nickname of „Green Hell“ – and rightly so: treacherous cambers, „blind corners“ and differing grip factors on the track make this course in the Eifel into a highly demanding challenge, especially for first-timers. Highly critical sections are signposted. Better safe than sorry: accordingly, speed must be reduced significantly in these sections. And there's one other thing you should always remember: The Nordschleife is not a modern racetrack but rather the world's most beautiful country road without oncoming traffic: So always avoid risks! In all other respects the posted safety rules and instructions shall apply.

### WHAT TO DO IN THE EVENT OF AN ACCIDENT:

Under no circumstances should you turn around or reverse. It is prohibited to drive on in the event of an accident. Park the car safely at the side of the track. Set up your warning triangle. Warn the drivers behind you but do not put yourself at risk. Provide first aid to casualties. Report the accident by calling the emergency number. When calling be sure to specify what has happened, where, and how many casualties there are.
